“Campus to Corporate: What Students Should Know Early”

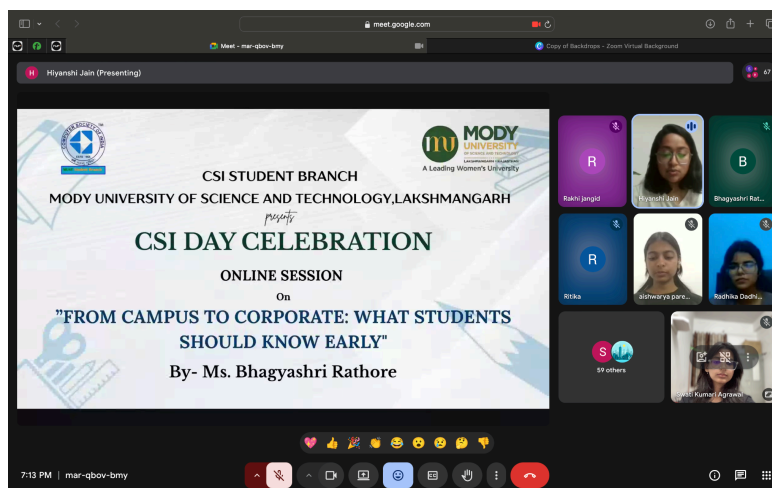

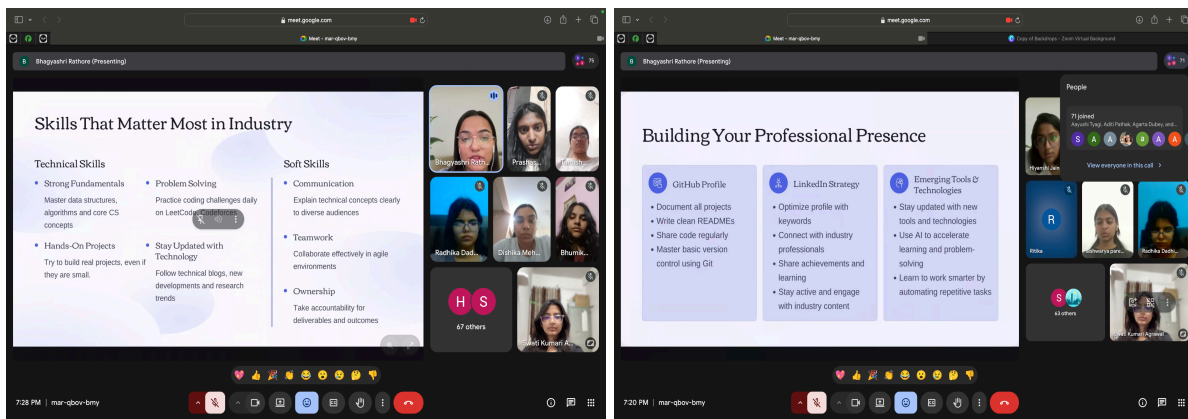

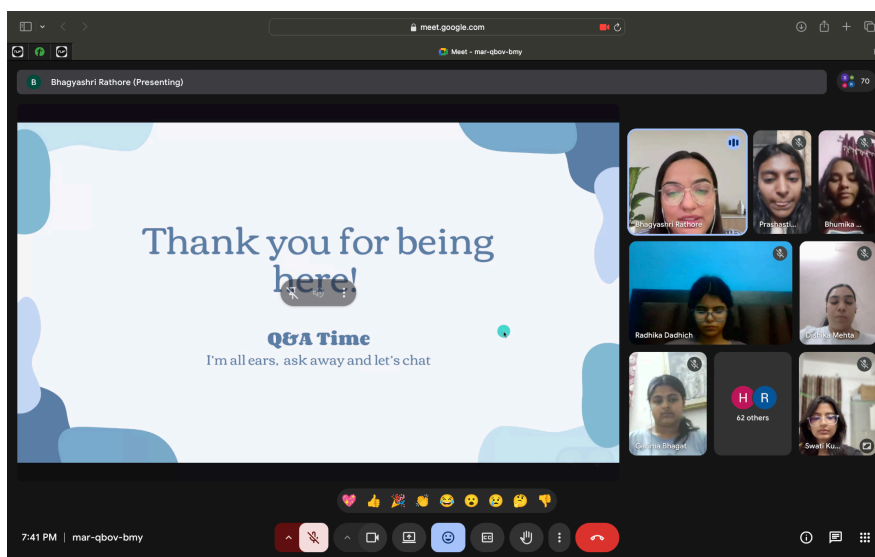
